Q6 — Biggest Challenges Facing the Sector & Actions Candidates Would Support	The biggest challenges currently facing nonprofits and charities in London is funding, increased costs and increasing need. Council engages with the sector as it sets its strategic plan, through initiatives like the economic development master plan, the downtown master plan, ongoing sector specific work in areas like health and homelessness, intimate partner violence, environmental and sustainability issues, anti-oppression and anti-racism work being done in the community etc. I am supportive of this ongoing work and engagement.

I think great cities are built on partnerships. As we build new community centres, renovate existing spaces and reimagine current locations- I am supportive of these conversations. An example of this, I worked with a developer in my ward to provide recreational space to the BGC London, the Lion's club and other groups while they were in the planning process. It allowed the organizations to try new activities in a part of the city where they had less presence and support the community differently.
