Network Mapping

- Network visualizations can help us gain insight into complex network relationships, between actors and events for example.
- In this example, individuals, organizations and events are displayed as circular nodes, and lines show the relationships between them.
- Visualizations of network nodes can reveal compelling patterns and phenomena that may otherwise be overlooked in other data presentation formats.


"Why" Network Mapping for Pillar?

- Gain insight into network transformations
- Which relationships are strongest/weakest?
- Who is at the center, connecting and bridging relationships?
- What activities are people entering our network through?
- Help evaluate the efficacy of specific activities in realizing organization's core strategic priorities
- E.g., in bringing together the 3 pillars of business, nonprofit and government; promoting equitable and inclusive communities, etc.
- Establish baseline of network evolution to compare network pre- and postmembership restructuring and inform strategy
- Facilitates development of narrative for network evolution


Network Visualization Analysis #1: Pillar Event Attendance, 2011-2018




- 2 events

- The three pillars of government, business and nonprofit are already represented at this early stage.




- Center: AGM

- Small network, not very connected yet.
- Actors at the center:



 Sexual Assault Centre London.




- Center populated with actors
- These prominently include academic Institutions and affiliates: e.g., Fanshawe, Western, Kings, Brescia, UWO Student Council, in addition to larger NP/Public orgs: United Way, London Public Library, Pillar.
- Periphery: Beginning of Social Innovation/Enterprise activities:
- Social Innovation Shared Space meeting, Social Enterprise Exchange, etc.)




- Network blossoms, density increases.
- Events at the center: "Community" focused events connect network:
- Rethink London Plan
 <u>Community</u> Discussion;
 Leading for <u>Community</u>
 Change; <u>Community</u>
 Collaboration Forum; PCIA
- Events at the periphery:
- Nonprofit Career Talks, All about boards/Board Governance, Crucial Conversations, Co-Strategy Programs



- Clusters begin to form around Social Enterprise and traditional Nonprofit.
- West-side clustering around SI/SE events
- E.g., "Anatomy of SE", "On the VERGE", "SE Breakfast with VERGE", "Social Innovation Exchange events"
- NP chats on the periphery, connecting to SE/SI events.
- Center: Imagine Canada's Public Policy roadshow, Diversity onboard program, AGM, Pillar Member Holiday Gathering, cross-sector collaborations: animating communities of change.
- East-side clustering: Learning and development for Nonprofit, All about board, etc.
- Connector events;: Engage with Western, Active Risk Mgmt, Crucial conversations.



- Innovation Works arrives, coincides with proliferation of social enterprise, social innovation, and IWcentered events.
- Network density increases.
- Events on Periphery attracting new entrants:
- Shifting from Ego to Eco; Innovation Works Block Party.
- Connector events at center:
- AGM; London's Social Economy: Today & Tomorrow; Inside Innovation Works: A member mixer.




Increased crossover between SE and NP events; slight de-clustering across network, for example...

- East quadrant: Verge Demo Day, Leadership Beyond the Box,
- West quadrant: Show me the money, SE Accelerator, Fundraising Fundamentals.
- South quadrant: Human Resources 101, All About Boards.

Conversation: exploring power

- · Density significantly increases.
- Events at the Periphery: Regional SE coaching Program, Careers and volunteers that give back, The changing landscape of employment: hiring, firing, marijuana, human rights.
- Events at the Center: AGM, UNSDGs, PCIA, Collaborative Community: Partner for Success with Western and Fanshawe, Leadership beyond the box, building resonance through datadriven storytelling webinar
- Clustering remerges:
 - E.g. 1: SI/SE/SF: Systems Thinking Exchange; Transform Capitalism; VERGE mixer, etc.
 - E.g. 2: NP- related: *Grant* seekers; crucial conversations; financial fitness
